Dear parents/carers,

Every year on World Book Day, we are overwhelmed by the enthusiasm our students show for reading. Whether by dressing up as characters or bringing their favourite books into school, the day has become an important and much-loved part of how we celebrate reading as a school community.

This year, to continue that tradition, students are invited to come into school dressed as their favourite book character on Thursday 5th March.

We would like to be clear that this is not a mufti (non-uniform) day. Students should either wear their normal school uniform or a book character costume. Costumes do not need to be elaborate or expensive; simple and creative ideas are more than welcome. Students may also bring a book or a small prop linked to their character if they wish.

While this day allows students the freedom to dress up, we maintain certain standards to ensure safety and decency. We therefore ask for your support in ensuring that students adhere to the following dress code:

- *Open-toed footwear is prohibited.*
- *Clothing considered too revealing, such as vest tops or tops that expose the midriff, is not allowed.*
- *Shorts must be of a reasonable length and should not have cut-out holes that expose excessive skin.*

The school reserves the right to determine what is deemed acceptable. Students who do not meet these expectations may be asked to change or will be provided with alternative clothing.

We very much look forward to seeing the imaginative ways our students bring their favourite characters to life and to celebrate our shared love of reading together.
