

Course Content

The Level 3 Subsidiary Diploma in Uniformed Public Services course is a 2 year course that is equivalent to 1 A Level. The course is worth 60 credits which are all coursework based and must be gained with 40 credits from mandatory units and 20 credits from optional units. You will be graded against the Pass/Merit/Distinction criteria set by BTEC. The Units are as follows

Mandatory:

- Government, Policies and the Public Services
- Leadership and Teamwork in the Public Services
- Citizenship, Diversity and the Public Services

Examples of optional units:

- Understanding Discipline in the Uniformed Public Services
- International Institutions and Human Rights
- Understand the Impact of War, Conflict and Terrorism on Public Services
- Crime and its Effects on Society

Skills and Qualifications Required

- A genuine interest in all aspects of Public Services.
- The majority of the course will be theoretical so you must be prepared to complete the coursework.
- Independent learning – Much of the course is coursework based and there is an expectation that you will complete work at home and in study periods as well as during timetabled lessons.
- Further research and reading – In order to achieve on this course you will be required to develop your knowledge in areas surrounding the units you are taught

Assessment

Coursework – All units are assessed internally by coursework which add up to 60 credits
